

Art and Design II	
Text:	Multiple Resources.
Supplemental Materials:	Sketchbook, handouts, variety of art materials.
Course Description:	Art and Design II is an entry level course that explores various painting techniques, media, aesthetic perceptions, and knowledge of historical developments in the arts. Students will use the Elements and Principles of Design to help them communicate meaning with paint. Students will build slowly on previous knowledge to create work that is increasingly more complex. As the course progresses students will develop a personal style to help them express themselves. There is also an interest in students working together to create a collaborative artwork. Finally a portfolio will be presented to their peers.
Methods of Evaluation:	As a studio course the largest part of a student's grade is made up of project grades. Using a grading rubric students are evaluated on successful use of techniques and concepts as well as following directions. There are also sketchbook and quiz grades.
Pace of Instruction:	1 st project-Line, Shape, Form 2 nd -Collaboration 3 rd -Color Theory 4 th - Tempera 5 th - Pen and Ink 6 th - Watercolor 7 th -9 th - Acrylic 10 th - Independent Project
