Liv and Sarah recommend the Wings of Fire Series by Tui T. Sutherland. These are fantasy stories featuring dragons. They need to be read in order and some are Reading Counts.

Jasmine recommends the Star Darlings Series by Shana Muldron Zappa. These are fantasy stories about getting wishes granted. They should be read in order. These are not Reading Counts books, but they are exciting to read.

Mollie recommends the Ranger in Time Series by Kate Messner. She enjoys the black and white pictures in the book. These are adventure stories about a time traveling dog. Many of them are Reading Counts.

Skylar recommends the Boxcar Children Series by Gertrude Chandler Warner. These stories are about four siblings who live in a boxcar and solve mysteries. They are Reading Counts.

Avery recommends Posy the Puppy in the Dr. Kitty Cat Series by Jane Clarke. This is a new series about a cat who is a doctor that helps injured animals. It is not Reading Counts yet, but keep checking back.

Grady recommends the Series of Unfortunate Events Books by Lemony Snicket. These are adventures stories about siblings who keep having bad things happen to them. They are Reading Counts.

Mrs. Olson recommends Gordon Korman books. He writes adventures with children as the main focus. Her favorite trilogy is the Everest Trilogy which is the story of a group of teenagers trying to be the youngest expedition to ever summit Mt. Everest. These need to be read in order. These are Reading Counts.
