Course Description:	Facing Life's Issues is a one-semester course (1/2 unit). The course examines various issues with which the students are currently involved during this time of their lives. The topics may vary from class to class as different students raise different issues. The course is a study of Christian ethics, their Biblical basis and their applications to various contemporary issues.
Methods of Evaluation:	Students will be evaluated by tests. There is also class work for each unit. A project is required each quarter.
Pace of Instruction:	The pace of instruction is determined by the students' needs and interests.
Course Objectives:	At the end of the course students should have a Biblical understanding of the various topics which have been discussed and studied in the class. Possible topics are: The Bible, Parents, War, Sex, Death and Dying, Marriage, Truth and Worldviews, Angels, Dating, Self Image, Alcohol and Drugs, Suicide, Date Rape, Gambling, Modern Slavery, Temptation, Abortion, and Euthanasia.
