Course Description:	. Mythology is an English elective which focuses on studying the myths of thousands of years ago when the ancients searched for their places in the world and explanations of the world around them. Included are stories of the Greek and Roman gods and goddesses and their origins, key dramas and characters, and their interactions with and influences on mortals. We will also discuss the differences between Greek culture and other cultures. Students will also focus on how the ancient Greek culture impacts our modern world
Methods of Evaluation:	Quizzes, tests, projects, and oral presentations
Pace of Instruction:	Approximately one chapter of Mythology a week with weekly quizzes over a chapter or tests over a thematic group of chapters. Projects and presentations occur once a month on average. The course is one semester in length and culminates in a semester exam.
Course Objectives:	Students will be able to recognize archetypal patterns from Greek mythology in Western literature. Students will be able to identify a myth, understand its reason for being in the ancient world, and understand its significance in the modern world.
