Course Description:	World War I is a one-semester course (1/2 Unit) focusing on the background, outbreak, campaigns, event, and effects of the First World War. Students will be expected to read text assignments and additional handout materials throughout the semester. Instruction will be lecture oriented and reinforced with numerous documentaries and historical dramas. The course units will present the background events and causes leading to the outbreak of war and a detailed examination of the course of the war from pre-1914 to 1918 and the Peace of Versailles.
Methods of Evaluation:	Students will be evaluated primarily by tests. Additional credit can be earned outside of class attendance film sessions.
