Methods of Evaluation:	Students will be evaluated on their
	proficiency levels in the four
	communicative strands of reading, writing,
	listening, and speaking. They will also be
	tested on vocabulary and grammatical
	concepts studied. Methods include tests,
	quizzes, classwork, homework, oral
	presentations, projects, semester exams
	and/or any other forms of evaluation
	instruments the instructor finds applicable
	to the course.

Pace of Instruction:	First Semester: Students will review
	concepts and vocabulary from Spanish III
	and will cover Chapters 1-4 in the primary
	text. They will also read the novel and use
	the videotapes for El Ultimo Secreto. The
	instructor will use the secondary text and
	other supplementary materials as time
	permits.
	Second Semester: Students will cover
	Chapters 5-6 in the primary text and read a
	novel in Spanish. The instructor will use
	the secondary text and other supplementary
	materials as time permits.

Course Objectives:	This course is designed to be a rigorous
·	preparation for students planning to
	continue to the Advanced Placement
	Spanish Language class and/or to study
	Spanish at the college level. Students
	should function in the Intermediate or
	Advanced Intermediate proficiency level in
	their communicative skills by the end of
	the fourth year. Students will demonstrate
	mastery of all basic Spanish grammar and
	will be able to recognize and use
	effectively all verb tenses and moods.
	Students will also demonstrate a working
	knowledge of major Spanish and Latin
	American authors and artists and their
	works.
