| Course Description: | Introduction to the art of theater magic! | Methods of Evaluation: | Students are evaluated by the level of their participation in group activities, knowledge of theater terms, and the outcome of each semester's production. They are also teamed with the drama class for the end of the semester final exam productions. |
| Pace of Instruction: | The pace of instruction is fairly quick as the students must be familiar with all aspects of the theater to be able to produce a show by the middle of the semester. |
| Course Objectives: | Students working together as a team, communicating and cooperating, to produce shows. Students will learn correct terminology for all areas of the theater. Students are encouraged to be organized, creative, and to think outside of the box! |
