



Summer Reading: Grade 3

Students will be required to read two books:

- One fiction book of the student's choice and on their reading level
- One non-fiction book of the student's choice and on their reading level

Third grade summer reading will be utilized when they return to school as a part of book talks in the classroom, as well as a way to launch the reading block for the year. Students should feel comfortable enough with their two books to summarize the book and to give an opinion on the book to other readers. For the fiction book, have students look for main characters, setting, the problem, the solution, and the plot (beginning, middle, and end). Students should be able to give three ideas or interesting facts about their nonfiction book.
